## Working paper submitted by Argentina

Recommendations on issues under cluster V, communication

Identification of additional measures to strengthen and/or clarify the commitments already assumed in the Programme of Action (e.g., the adoption of new documents on best practices for inclusion in the Programme of Action at the upcoming biennial meetings or the second Review Conference)

1. Although the ideal situation would be the adoption of annexes to be incorporated into the Programme of Action during the first Review Conference, realistically speaking, at least a commitment could be made to launch a process for the preparation of documents that could be incorporated into the upcoming biennial meetings of the States to consider the implementation of the Programme of Action.

2. These new documents would not necessarily expressly require adherence by all Member States since they could be used as action guides, as in the case of the Inter-American Convention against the Illicit Manufacturing of and Trafficking in Firearms, Ammunition, Explosives, and Other Related Materials with Inter-American Drug Abuse Control Commission model regulations.

3. The following issues were identified:

(a) Suggestions and lessons learned to improve the link between Governments and non-governmental organizations in the national, regional and global fields and their links with the United Nations (sect. I, para. 16, sect. II, paras. 20 and 40, sect. III, para. 2, and sect. IV, para. 2 (c));

(b) Best practices and lessons learned for greater information exchange with regional organizations.
