

LETTER DATED 17 AUGUST 1977 FROM THE CHAIRMAN OF THE SPECIAL COMMITTEE ON THE SITUATION WITH REGARD TO THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE DECLARATION ON THE GRANTING OF INDEPENDENCE TO COLONIAL COUNTRIES AND PEOPLES ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL

I have the honour to transmit herewith, for the attention of the Security Council, the text of a resolution concerning activities of foreign economic and other interests which are impeding the implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples in Southern Rhodesia and Namibia and in all other Territories under colonial domination and efforts to eliminate colonialism, <u>apartheid</u> and racial discrimination in southern Africa, adopted by the Special Committee on the Situation with regard to the Implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples at its 1087th meeting on 2 August 1977.*

Paragraph 10 of the resolution reads as follows:

"Expresses its conviction that the scope of sanctions against the illegal régime in Southern Rhodesia (Zimbabwe) should be widened to include all the measures envisaged under Article 41 of the Charter and expresses the hope that the Security Council will consider adopting appropriate measures in that regard;".
