COMMISSION ON HUMAN RIGHTS Fifth session

> SUGGESTIONS RECARDING THE PROCEDURE OF THE COMMISSION (Memorandum by the Secretary-General)

1. Because several members of the Commission have not completed their work as members of the Third Committee of the General Assembly, the Commission may conceivably postpone the **holding** of daily plenary meetings for one week, until 16 May 1949. If this is done, the Commission may wish to consider which items of its provisional agenda (E/CN.4/161) might be disposed of at the first meeting of the fifth session, and which items might at that time be referred to committees for immediate consideration.

2. The Secretary-General suggests that the following items might be dealt with during the first meeting of the fifth session:

- 1. Adoption of the agenda
- 2. Election of officers
- 3. Invitation to the officers of the Commission on the Status of Women.

(NOTE: Item 3 is procedurally urgent because it may be necessary to arrange for the presence of a representative of the Commission on the Status of Women at the fifth session).

3. The Secretary-General further suggests that the following committees be constituted at the first meeting of the fifth session, to consider the indicated items of the agenda during the week of May 9-16:

- 1. COMMITTEE ON PREVENTION OF DISCRIMINATION AND PROTECTION OF MINORITIES
 - Item 4. Sub-Commission on the Prevention of Discrimination and the Protection of Minorities:
 - (a) terms of reference of the Sub-Commission
 - (b) election of new members of the Sub-Commission.
 - Item 8. The fate of minorities.
 - Item 9. Report by the Secretary-General on the question of the continuing validity of the minorities treaties and declarations (if ready).
 - Item 10. Examination of texts submitted by the Sub-Commission on the Prevention of Discrimination and the Protection of /Minorities.

(NOTE:

Item 4 (a) is particularly urgent from a procedural point of view inasmuch as the Sub-Commission is scheduled to convene at Lake Success for its second session on 13 June; the members must be advised of any revision in the Sub-Commission's terms of reference well in advance of that date. Item 4 (b) is also procedurally urgent; the machinery whereby new members of the Sub-Commission are to be nominated and elected must be established early in the session in order that the actual election may take place before its end.)
