I have the honour to refer to your cable message addressed to the Minister of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Korea concerning Security Council resolution 418 (1977) and, under instructions from my Government, would like to inform you that the position of the Republic of Korea is as follows:

1. It has been the consistent position of the Republic of Korea not to provide South Africa with any arms or related matériel; such position shall be consistently maintained in the future.

2. The Republic of Korea fully supports resolution 418 (1977) adopted by the Security Council at its 2046th meeting on 4 November 1977 and will act strictly in accordance with the provisions of the resolution.

I would appreciate it if you would have this letter circulated as a document of the Security Council.
