## Annex

## Letter dated 26 October 1983 from the President of Madagascar, Mr. Didier Ratsiraka, addressed to the Secretary-General

We learned with consternation of the overthrow and assassination of our comrade, Prime Minister Bishop of Grenada. We therefore strongly condemn this assassination on the strength of the principle that we have always defended and applied, whereby dialogue and democratic procedures, and not political assassination, are the only valid and viable means of resolving contradictions and settling internal and external conflicts.

But we no less strongly condemn the military intervention of the United States and certain Caribbean States on the strength of the principle, accepted by the international community, of non-interference in the internal affairs of other States. Indeed, if such practices were to become a habit, no small independent State would any longer be able to establish the régime of its choice or exercise its inalienable right to self-determination.

We therefore consider it a matter of urgency that you should use your moral authority to exert pressure on the international community and especially on the great Powers, in order to prevent a repetition of such highly condemnable acts and demand the withdrawal of the foreign intervention forces from Grenada.
