

## Summary statement by the Secretary-General on matters of which the Security Council is seized and on the stage reached in their consideration

## Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in document S/2006/10 of 1 March 2006.

During the week ending 25 February 2006, the Security Council took action on the following items:

## **Briefings by Chairmen of subsidiary bodies of the Security Council** (*see* S/2003/40/Add.51; S/2004/20/Add.51; and S/2005/15/Add.16, 28, 42 and 50)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5375th meeting, held on 21 February 2006 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Algeria, Austria, Brazil, Indonesia, Israel, the Syrian Arab Republic and Venezuela (Bolivarian Republic of), at their request, to participate in the consideration of the item without the right to vote.

In accordance with the understanding reached in the Council's prior consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended invitations under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Ellen Margrethe Løj, Chairman of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1373 (2001), concerning counter-terrorism; César Mayoral, Chairman of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1267 (1999), concerning Al-Qaida and the Taliban and associated individuals and entities; and Peter Burian, Chairman of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1540 (2004).

## **United Nations peacekeeping operations** (*see* S/2004/20/Add.20; and S/2005/15/Add.21)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5376th and 5379th meetings, held on 22 and 23 February 2006, respectively, in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

At the 5376th meeting, the President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Austria, Malaysia, Sierra Leone, Singapore and South Africa, at their request, to participate in the consideration of the item without the right to vote.

In accordance with the understanding reached in the Council's prior consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Mark Malloch Brown, Under-Secretary-General and Chef de Cabinet of the Executive Office of the Secretary-General.

At the 5379th meeting, the President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Austria, Brazil, Canada and Singapore, at their request, to participate in the consideration of the item without the right to vote.

In accordance with the understanding reached in the Council's prior consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Jean-Marie Guéhenno, Under-Secretary-General for Peacekeeping Operations.

In accordance with the understanding reached in the Council's prior consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to His Royal Highness Prince Zeid Ra'ad Zeid Al-Hussein, Adviser to the Secretary-General on Sexual Exploitation and Abuse by United Nations Peacekeeping Personnel.

In accordance with the understanding reached in the Council's prior consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Juan Gabriel Valdés, Special Representative of the Secretary-General and Head of the United Nations Stabilization Mission in Haiti.
