LETTER DATED 4 MARCH 1965 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF
CONGO (BRAZZAVILLE) ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY
COUNCIL

On instructions from my Government, I have the honour to draw your attention once more to the intolerable acts of provocation committed by Mr. Salazar's Government against the Government and people of Congo (Brazzaville).

In letter No. 1566 of 10 February^{1/} I informed you of the violation of our frontier by fifteen Portuguese soldiers at the village of Tchissakata. On this later occasion, on Saturday, 16 January 1965, twenty-five armed Portuguese soldiers from Cabinda raided the same Congolese village of Tchissakata, in Kouilou Prefecture. As is their practice, these soldiers threatened the peaceful inhabitants and searched the houses.

The Government of Congo (Brazzaville) once again makes a strong protest against these barbaric acts and has the honour to inform you that the necessary steps will be taken if these acts of aggression and intimidation recur.

I would ask you to inform the other members of the Security Council of this matter.
