In addition military and civilian personnel from the Swedish Armed Forces and the Swedish Rescue Services Agency have participated in humanitarian mine action for the UN and for various NGOs, for example in Lebanon, Eritrea, Iraq, Sudan, Sri Lanka and Chad. SRSA Mine Action projects are mainly funded through Sida and the UN.

SRSA currently has ongoing support projects in the following countries: Eritrea: support to UNOPS with 1 IMSMA Officer funded by Sida. Sudan: support to UNOPS and UNMAS with staff for planning and Mine Detection Dog QA, IMSMA and logistics funded by Sida. Completed projects 2005: Somalia EOD trainers funded by Sida. Russia: UXO survey funded by Sida.
