LETTER DATED 21 FEBRUARY 1989 FROM THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL

I have the honour to refer to paragraph 59 of my further report of 23 January 1989 on the implementation of Security Council resolutions 435 (1978) and 439 (1978) concerning the question of Namibia (S/20412) in which I said that, after consulting the parties, I would seek the Security Council's agreement to proposals for the composition of the military component of UNTAG.

Having now completed my consultations with the parties, I propose that the various units in the military component should be contributed by the following countries:

- (a) Infantry battalions: Bangladesh, Finland, Kenya, Malaysia, Togo, Venezuela, Yugoslavia.
- (b) Military Observers: Bangladesh, Czechoslovakia, Finland, India, Ireland, Kenya, Malaysia, Pakistan, Panama, Peru, Poland, Sudan, Togo, Yugoslavia.
- (c) Logistic Units: Australia, Canada, Denmark, Italy, Poland, Spain, United Kingdom.

In addition, the logistic units will include civilian elements contributed by the Federal Republic of Germany and Switzerland.

I should be grateful if you would bring this matter to the attention of the members of the Security Council.
