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Summary statement by the Secretary-General on matters of which the Security Council is seized and on the stage reached in their consideration

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in documents S/2006/10 of 1 March 2006, S/2006/10/Add.12 of 7 April 2006, S/2006/10/Add.15 of 28 April 2006 and S/2006/10/Add.16 of 5 May 2006.

During the week ending 13 May 2006, the Security Council took action on the following items:

Meeting of the Security Council with the troop-contributing countries to the United Nations Mission in Ethiopia and Eritrea pursuant to resolution 1353 (2001), annex II, sections A and B (see S/2001/15/Add.37; S/2002/30/Add.10 and 32; S/2003/40/Add.10 and 36; S/2004/20/Add.10 and 36; and S/2005/15/Add.9, 35 and 41)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5433rd (private) meeting, held on 8 May 2006 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

At the close of the meeting, in accordance with rule 55 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the following communiqué was issued through the Secretary-General in place of a verbatim record:

On 8 May 2006, the Security Council, pursuant to annex II, sections A and B, of resolution 1353 (2001), held its 5433rd meeting in private with the troop-contributing countries to the United Nations Mission in Ethiopia and Eritrea (UNMEE).

The Security Council and the troop-contributing countries heard a briefing under rule 39 of its provisional rules of procedure by Hédi Annabi, Assistant Secretary-General for Peacekeeping Operations.

Members of the Council, Mr. Annabi and representatives of participating troop-contributing countries had an exchange of views.

Reports of the Secretary-General on the Sudan (see S/2004/20/Add.23, 30, 35, 37, 39, 40, 44, 46 and 49; S/2005/15/Add.1, 4-6, 9-12, 18, 25, 28, 30, 37, 40, 49 and 50; and S/2006/10/Add.1, 4, 11, 12 and 14-16)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5434th meeting, held on 9 May 2006 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Austria, Canada, the Netherlands, Nigeria and the Sudan, at their request, to participate in the consideration of the item without the right to vote.

In response to the request contained in a letter dated 8 May 2006 from the Permanent Representative of Qatar to the United Nations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Yahya A. Mahmassani, Permanent Observer for the League of Arab States to the United Nations.

The President stated that, following consultations of the Council, he had been authorized to make a statement on behalf of the Council and read out the text of that statement (for the text, see S/PRST/2006/21; to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1 August 2005-31 July 2006*).

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5435th meeting, held on 10 May 2006 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it a letter dated 4 May 2006 from the Chairman of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 751 (1992) concerning Somalia addressed to the President of the Security Council (S/2006/229).

The President drew attention to a draft resolution (S/2006/287) that had been prepared in the course of the Council's prior consultations.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/2006/287, and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1676 (2006) (for the text, see S/RES/1676 (2006)); to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1 August 2005-31 July 2006*).

The situation in Timor-Leste (see S/11593/Add.50 and 51; S/11935/Add.15 and 16; S/1999/25/Add.17, 22, 25, 30, 33-36, 42 and 50; S/2000/40/Add.4, 11, 16, 20, 25, 29, 30, 34, 35, 37, 38, 40 and 46-48; S/2001/15/Add.4, 5, 14, 20, 31, 34, 37 and 44; S/2002/30/Add.4, 16, 17, 19, 20, 32 and 45; S/2003/40/Add.10, 13, 17, 20 and 41; S/2004/20/Add.7, 19, 34 and 46; S/2005/15/Add.8, 16, 19 and 34; and S/2006/10/Add.3 and 17)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5436th meeting, held on 12 May 2006 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the end of the mandate report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations Office in Timor-Leste (S/2006/251).

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative of Timor-Leste, at her request, to participate in the consideration of the item without the right to vote.

The President drew attention to a draft resolution (S/2006/290) that had been prepared in the course of the Council's prior consultations.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/2006/290, and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1677 (2006) (for the text, see S/RES/1677 (2006)); to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1 August 2005-31 July 2006*.
