LETTER OF 5 DECEMBER 1970 ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE
SECURITY COUNCIL BY THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF CUBA TO
THE UNITED NATIONS

On instructions from the Revolutionary Government of Cuba, I have the honour to request that I should be invited to attend the meetings which the Security Council is now holding in order to consider the complaint by the Republic of Guinea concerning the aggression committed against that country.

I should be grateful if this request could be brought to the attention of the members of the Security Council.
