CABLE DATED 18 AUGUST 1965 FROM THE ASSISTANT SECRETARY-
GENERAL OF THE ORGANIZATION OF AMERICAN STATES ADDRESSED
TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL OF THE UNITED NATIONS

In the absence of the Secretary-General, I have the honour to transmit to you for the information of the Security Council, in accordance with Article 54 of the Charter of the United Nations, the text of cable No. 539 of today's date, which the Ad Hoc Committee has sent to the President of the Tenth Meeting of Consultation:

"Since the presentation of the Act of Dominican Reconciliation on 9 August, there has been an uninterrupted series of meetings with representatives of the two 'governments'.

"The 'Government of National Reconstruction' has notified the Ad Hoc Committee that it accepts the Act in the form in which it was submitted. As regards the 'Constitutional Government', the Ad Hoc Committee has been considering with its representatives the observations which that 'Government' has made concerning the text of the Act of Dominican Reconciliation; however, the negotiations have at no time been interrupted.

"Fully aware of the delicacy and extreme importance of the mission assigned to it by the Tenth Meeting of Consultation of Ministers of Foreign Affairs and realizing that the purpose of that mission is to bring peace and prosperity to the Dominican people, the Ad Hoc Committee is still determined to overcome the remaining difficulties, which are essentially of a procedural nature.

"The Ad Hoc Committee will continue to keep the Meeting of Consultation informed of the progress of these negotiations.
