**Communiqué from the press centre of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Azerbaijan**

The Republic of Azerbaijan welcomes the statement on global energy issues adopted at the Group of Eight Summit, held from 15 to 17 July 2006 in Saint Petersburg.

The plan of action on global energy security contained in this document is a constructive and important mechanism, a kind of strategic programme that addresses many issues in the field of global energy security. The provisions on effective market access, diversification of energy supply and demand, energy sources, transportation routes and means of transport, and deployment and transfer of clean energy technologies are especially important. Azerbaijan especially welcomes the commitment by the Group of Eight countries to ensure sufficient, reliable and environmentally responsible supplies of energy, which is of critical importance for improving the quality of life of the peoples of the world's countries.

Azerbaijan fully agrees with the members of the Group of Eight that, against a background of growing interdependence, strengthened partnership is required between all stakeholders. In this connection, Azerbaijan emphasizes the importance of the exceptional success achieved in increasing production of hydrocarbons in the Caspian Sea and in establishing a world-class hydrocarbon extraction and production system and transport infrastructure, including the Heydar Aliyev Baku-Tbilisi-Ceyhan oil pipeline. The discussion of energy security issues at the Summit took place virtually simultaneously with the official opening of the pipeline, which will play a strategic role in the development of Caspian oil resources and in their efficient transportation to world markets along the East-West energy corridor, as well as establishing a solid foundation for economic growth, regional stability and international energy security. Azerbaijan is committed to further strengthening and expanding the East-West energy corridor and, along with its partners, is looking forward to the successful completion of the South Caucasus gas pipeline (Baku-Tbilisi-Erzurum); the opening in the near future of the Baku-Tbilisi-Akhalkalaki-Kars railway will create additional possibilities for transporting energy on this route.

Azerbaijan supports the joint efforts to which the statement by the Group of Eight countries bears witness and will make its contribution to enhancing global energy security through actions to increase the transparency, predictability and stability of global energy markets, improve the investment climate in the energy sector, ensure the physical security of critical energy infrastructure and address climate change and sustainable development.
