

¹ In paragraph 4 of its resolution 60/99 of 8 December 2005, the General Assembly endorsed the recommendation of the Committee on the Peaceful Uses of Outer Space that the Legal Subcommittee, at its forty-fifth session, taking into account the concerns of all countries, in particular those of developing countries, should consider items 5, 6, 7 and 8 as regular items of the agenda, should consider items 9 and 10 as single issues and items for discussion and should consider item 11 in accordance with the workplan adopted by the Committee. In paragraph 5 of the same resolution, the Assembly noted that the Subcommittee, at its forty-fifth session, would submit proposals to the Committee for new items to be considered by the Subcommittee at its forty-sixth session, in 2007.

- Examination and review of the developments concerning the draft protocol on matters specific to space assets to the Convention on International Interests in Mobile Equipment.

2. Election of the Chairman

In accordance with the agreement reached by the Committee on the Peaceful Uses of Outer Space at its forty-sixth session on the measures relating to the future composition of the bureaux of the Committee and its subsidiary bodies,² and pursuant to the measures relating to the working methods of the Committee and its subsidiary bodies,³ the Group of Latin American and Caribbean States nominated Raimundo González Aninat (Chile) for the office of Chair of the Legal Subcommittee for the period 2006-2007.

In paragraphs 56 and 57 of its resolution 60/99, the General Assembly agreed that the Legal Subcommittee should elect its Chairman and noted that the Committee, at its forty-ninth session, would endorse the election.

6. Status and application of the five United Nations treaties on outer space

In paragraph 6 of its resolution 60/99, the General Assembly noted that the Legal Subcommittee would reconvene its Working Group on the Status and Application of the Five United Nations Treaties on Outer Space and review the need to extend the mandate of the Working Group beyond the forty-fifth session of the Subcommittee.

At its fortieth session, in 2001, the Legal Subcommittee agreed that the topics addressed in the discussions of the Working Group would include the status of the treaties, the review of their implementation and obstacles to their universal acceptance, as well as the promotion of space law, especially through the United Nations Programme on Space Applications (A/AC.105/763 and Corr.1, para. 118). At its forty-first session, in 2002, the Subcommittee agreed that the Working Group would review any new, similar issues that might be raised in discussions in the Working Group, provided that those issues fell within its existing mandate (A/AC.105/787, paras. 138 and 140).

7. Information on the activities of international organizations relating to space law

In the discussion of this item, member States may bring to the attention of the Legal Subcommittee any information on the activities of international organizations relating to space law. In accordance with the agreement reached at the forty-eighth session of the Committee, international organizations were invited to report to the Subcommittee on their activities.⁴

8. Matters relating to:

- (a) The definition and delimitation of outer space
- (b) The character and utilization of the geostationary orbit, including consideration of ways and means to ensure the rational and equitable use of the geostationary orbit without prejudice to the role of the International Telecommunication Union

In paragraph 7 of its resolution 60/99, the General Assembly noted that the Legal Subcommittee would reconvene its Working Group on this item only to consider matters relating to the definition and delimitation of outer space.

11. Practice of States and international organizations in registering space objects

In paragraph 8 of its resolution 60/99, the General Assembly agreed that the Legal Subcommittee should reconvene its Working Group on the Practice of States and International Organizations in Registering Space Objects in accordance with the workplan adopted by the Committee at its forty-sixth session, in 2003. In accordance with that plan, the working group would, in 2006, identify common practices and draft recommendations for enhancing adherence to the Convention on Registration of Objects Launched into Outer Space (resolution 3235 (XXIX), annex).

Organization of work

- 1. At its forty-fourth session, in 2005, the Legal Subcommittee agreed that a flexible organization of work should continue to serve as the basis for organizing its work with a view to making fuller use of the conference services available (A/AC.105/850, para. 10). The work of the Subcommittee has been scheduled to afford the Working Groups that will be reconvened under items 6, 8 (a) and 11 the maximum amount of time available.
- 2. At the close of the afternoon meeting on 3 April 2006, a symposium entitled "Legal aspects of disaster management and the contribution of the law of outer space", sponsored by the International Institute of Space Law and the European Centre for Space Law, will be held.
