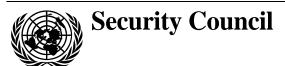

Summary statement by the Secretary-General on matters of which the Security Council is seized and on the stage reached in their consideration

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in document S/2007/10 of 9 February 2007.

During the week ending 13 January 2007, the Security Council took action on the following items:

Threats to international peace and security (see S/2005/15/Add.36)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5615th meeting, held on 8 January 2007 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

The President stated that, following consultations of the Council, he had been authorized to make a statement on behalf of the Council and read out the text of that statement (for the text, see S/PRST/2007/1; to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1 August 2006-31 July 2007*).

The situation concerning the Democratic Republic of the Congo (see

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5616th meeting, held on 9 January 2007 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.



The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of the Democratic Republic of the Congo and Germany, at their request, to participate in the consideration of the item without the right to vote.

In accordance with the understanding reached in the Council's prior consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended invitations under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Javier Solana, High Representative for the Common Foreign and Security Policy and Secretary-General of the Council of the European Union; Jean-Marie Guéhenno, Under-Secretary-General for Peacekeeping Operations; and Ibrahim Gambari, Under-Secretary-General for Political Affairs.

The situation in Côte d'Ivoire (*see* S/2002/30/Add.50; S/2003/40/Add.5, 17, 19, 29, 31, 45, 47 and 48; S/2004/20/Add.5, 8, 17, 21, 31, 44, 46 and 50; S/2005/15/Add.4, 12, 13, 16, 17, 21, 24, 26, 34, 40, 41 and 47-49; and S/2006/10/Add.2, 3, 5, 7, 12, 16, 20, 21, 28, 31, 36, 42, 43, 49 and 50)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5617th meeting, held on 10 January 2007 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the eleventh progress report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations Operation in Côte d'Ivoire (S/2006/939).

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative of Côte d'Ivoire, at his request, to participate in the consideration of the item without the right to vote.

The President drew attention to a draft resolution (S/2007/8) submitted by France.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/2007/8, and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1739 (2007) (for the text, see S/RES/1739 (2007); to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1 August 2006-31 July 2007*).

Non-proliferation/Democratic People's Republic of Korea (see S/2006/10/Add.40)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5618th meeting, held on 11 January 2007 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

The situation in Myanmar (see S/2006/10/Add.36 and 38)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5619th meeting, held on 12 January 2007 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative of Myanmar, at his request, to participate in the consideration of the item without the right to vote.

The President drew attention to a draft resolution (S/2007/14) submitted by the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the United States of America and made an oral revision to the text in its provisional form.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/2007/14, as orally revised in its provisional form, which received 9 votes in favour (Belgium, France, Ghana, Italy, Panama, Peru, Slovakia, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, United States of America), 3 against (China, Russian Federation, South Africa) and 3 abstentions (Congo, Indonesia, Qatar), and was not adopted, owing to the negative vote of a permanent member of the Council.
