draft resolutions A/C.2/61/L.23, A/C.2/61/L.24, A/C.2/61/L.25, A/C.2/61/L.26, A/C.2/61/L.27, A/C.2/61/L.28, A/C.2/61/L.29, A/C.2/61/L.30, A/C.2/61/L.31 and A/C.2/61/L.33. Since all the draft resolutions on sustainable development were extremely important, it was to be hoped that the related informal consultations would be completed in an expeditious manner.

2. **Mr. Fonseca** (Brazil), Vice-Chairman, said that Israel and Japan had joined the list of sponsors of draft resolution A/C.2/61/L.29.

3. **Mr. Gerus** (Belarus) introduced draft resolution A/C.2/61/L.32, which was intended as a tribute to the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF), the world's most prominent and powerful defender and supporter of children and their rights. A special commemorative meeting of the General Assembly would be held in December 2006 as a further token of acknowledgement and respect for UNICEF, for which no amount of praise, encouragement or admiration could ever be sufficient.

4. **The Chairperson** introduced conference room paper A/C.2/61/CRP.2 on policies of United Nations system organizations towards the use of open source software for development. The paper contained the response of the Joint Inspection Unit (JIU) to the Secretary-General's report on information and communication technologies for development: progress in the implementation of General Assembly resolution 57/295 (document A/61/254), and to the comments of the Secretary-General and of the United Nations System Chief Executives Board for Coordination on the report of JIU (JIU/REP/2005/7 and Corr.1), contained in documents A/61/94 and Add.1. The three documents had been introduced to the Committee at its

12th meeting. She took it that the Committee wished to take note of the JIU conference room paper.

6. **Mr. Gerus** (Belarus) introduced draft resolution A/C.2/61/L.11/Rev.1, which contained a very comprehensive and balanced text.

7. **Ms. Mammadova** (Azerbaijan) said that Belgium, Greece, Hungary, Latvia, Mongolia, Serbia, Slovenia, Turkey and Uzbekistan had joined the list of sponsors of the draft resolution.

8. **The Chairperson** announced that the draft resolution had no programme budget implications, and that Chile, Israel and Moldova also wished to join the list of co-sponsors.

9. *Draft resolution A/C.2/61/L.11/Rev.1 was adopted.*

10. **Mr. Koudelka** (Czech Republic), speaking also on behalf of Bulgaria, Estonia, Hungary, Latvia, Lithuania, Romania, Slovakia and Slovenia, recalled that the first General Assembly resolution on countries with economies in transition had been adopted in 1992. Over the intervening 14 years, the nine countries in question had successfully transformed themselves from centrally planned economies into market-oriented economies, and should therefore no longer be considered as countries with economies in transition. All nine countries would continue to support the remaining countries with economies in transition in their efforts to integrate into the world economy.

15. **The Chairperson** announced that the draft resolution had no programme budget implications, and that Afghanistan, Cape Verde, Ghana, Grenada, Iceland, India, Nigeria, Pakistan, Portugal, Senegal, Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, Timor-Leste and the United Republic of Tanzania wished to join the list of sponsors.
