## Subject: First day of issue - 15 March 2007: "Endangered Species" series and annual collection folders

## Commemorative stamps

1. On Thursday, 15 March 2007, the United Nations Postal Administration (UNPA) will issue a set of 12 stamps depicting endangered species of fauna. It will be the fifteenth set of stamps in the UNPA multi-year series on endangered species, which was launched on 3 March 1993 to highlight the need for the protection of species throughout the world that are in danger of extinction. This series of stamps were designed by John Rowe (United States of America).

2. The issue will consist of three sheets of 16 stamps each, in denominations of $\$ 0.39$, F.s. 1.00 and $€ 0.55$. Each sheet will illustrate four different endangered species.
(United States equivalents - F.s. 1.00: \$0.83 and €0.55: \$0.72, subject to exchange rate fluctuation.)

## 2007 Endangered Species annual collection

3. On 15 March, the United Nations Postal Administration will release the 2007 Endangered Species annual collection folder of single mint stamps.
4. The 2007 annual collection will be contained in a specially designed album. The album devotes separate pages to each of the 12 endangered species. Descriptive information is provided in English, French and German, and each stamp is beautifully highlighted by a colourful array of photographs relative to the species. It should be noted that the Endangered Species series will not be included in the annual collection albums to be issued later in 2007.
5. The stamps are not affixed inside the album, although spaces and mounts have been provided for this purpose.

## Triple-cancelled Endangered Species annual collection folder

6. Since the 2007 Endangered Species annual collection folder will contain stamps in all three denominations, special arrangements have been made by UNPA to make available to its collectors the Endangered Species collection folder, in which the stamps will be affixed and cancelled 15 March, the first day of issue in New York, Geneva or Vienna, as appropriate.
7. The policy of offering triple cancellations for the Endangered Species annual collection will continue throughout the duration of this series.

## Maximum cards

8. The twenty-eighth set of UNPA maximum cards will also be issued on 15 March 2007. Three different cards will be produced to accommodate the three different se-tenant blocks of four stamps being issued. To conform to the maximum cards issued for the Endangered Species series in prior years, each maximum card will reproduce photographs of the species appearing on each of the stamps in the se-tenant block. The appropriate se-tenant blocks of stamps will be affixed and cancelled first day of issue for each respective office. The maximum card cancelled United Nations New York will sell for \$1.94. The cancelled United Nations Geneva card is priced at \$3.69, while the cancelled United Nations Vienna card is priced at $\$ 3.28$. Because of a new uniform pricing structure instituted in 2007 for the three UNPA offices, all three maximum cards are now subject to exchange rate fluctuations.
9. UNPA will sell the plain cards (without stamps affixed) for $\$ 0.25$.

## Special limited silk cover

10. The release of the 2007 Endangered Species series stamps will coincide with the Postage Stamp Mega Event to be held at Madison Square Garden from 15 to 18 March. To mark this event, UNPA has produced a special limited-edition silk cover. The $\$ 0.39$ Cercocebus torquatus, the F.s. 1.00 Varecia variegate and the $€ 0.55$ Chlorocebus aethiops will be affixed to the covers and cancelled appropriately. The covers will sell for $\$ 3.95$ while supplies last.

## General information

11. For the convenience of collectors, UNPA at Headquarters will provide prepared and cancelled New York, Geneva and Vienna first-day covers on the UNPA official first-day cachets only. Members of delegations and the staff can obtain those items on Thursday, 15 March, at the following locations:
(a) UNPA sales counter in the concourse of the General Assembly Building, from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.;
(b) Temporary sales counter located on the east side of the Secretariat Lobby, against the windows located between the cafeteria and news-stand, from $9 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$. to 4 p.m.
12. First-day-of-issue cancellations can be obtained at a temporary United States Postal Service substation located outside the United Nations Bookshop in the concourse of the General Assembly Building, from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.
