1. Opening of the session

The representative of the Secretary-General will open the sixth session of the Committee.

2. Adoption of the agenda

In accordance with rule 7, the Committee may revise the agenda during a session and may, as appropriate, defer or delete items.

At its sixth session, the Committee will consider the initial report received from Egypt (CMW/C/EGY/1). The Secretary-General has informed the State party concerned that its report is scheduled for consideration by the Committee on Tuesday, 24 April 2007.
