Adoption of the agenda

The agenda was adopted.

The situation in the Middle East

Letter dated 15 March 2007 from the Secretary-General addressed to the President of the Security Council (S/2007/150)

The President: I should like to inform the Council that I have received a letter from the representative of Lebanon in which she requests to be invited to participate in the consideration of the item on the Council's agenda. In conformity with the usual practice, I propose, with the consent of the Council, to invite that representative to participate in the consideration of the item, without the right to vote, in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Charter and rule 37 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure.

There being no objection, it is so decided.

At the invitation of the President, Ms. Ziade (Lebanon) took a seat at the Council table.

The President: The Security Council will now begin its consideration of the item on its agenda. The Council is meeting in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

Members of the Council have before them document S/2007/171, which contains the text of a

draft resolution prepared in the course of the Council's prior consultations. Members also have before them document S/2007/150, which contains a letter dated 15 March 2007 from the Secretary-General transmitting the seventh report of the International Independent Investigation Commission.

I wish to draw the attention of members to document S/2007/159, which contains a letter dated 20 March 2007 from the Chargé d'affaires of the Permanent Mission of Lebanon addressed to the Secretary-General.

It is my understanding that the Council is ready to proceed to the vote on the draft resolution before it. Unless I hear any objection, I shall put the draft resolution to the vote now.

There being no objection, it is so decided.

A vote was taken by show of hands.

In favour:

Belgium, China, Congo, France, Ghana, Indonesia, Italy, Panama, Peru, Qatar, Russian Federation, Slovakia, South Africa, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, United States of America

The President: There were 15 votes in favour. The draft resolution has been adopted unanimously as resolution 1748 (2007).

The Security Council has thus concluded the present stage of its consideration of the item on its agenda.
