CIRCULAR No. 18

Subject: World Health Assembly - WHO/International Labour Conference - ILO

1. The sixtieth session of the World Health Assembly and the ninety-fifth session of the International Labour Conference will be held at the Palais des Nations, from 14 to 23 May 2007 and 29 May to 15 June 2007, respectively.
2. High-ranking officials and many delegates will be attending these events at the United Nations Office at Geneva. Vehicular and pedestrian access to and movement within the Palais grounds are likely to be difficult. During each of these sessions, some parts of the Palais may also be temporarily declared “high-security areas”.
3. Some car parks will be reserved for these conferences during the dates indicated above, as follows:
 - All of P-3 and P-5 (lower).

However, to facilitate parking, the *Cour d'honneur* will be open. Staff members are requested to park diagonally to the kerb. Members of Permanent Missions are requested to park in the areas reserved for them, namely:

- Car park P-10, facing door 40
 - The underground garage located on level B of the E building
 - The Secretariat building courtyard by door 6.
4. The arrangements for access to the Palais will not change:
 - The Pregny gate will be open 24 hours a day.
 - The railway gate will be open between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. on working days only.

The Place des Nations gate will be open to pedestrians between 7 a.m. and 8 p.m. on working days only. At all other times, including weekends, access shall be through the Pregny gate.

5. It would be appreciated if everyone would cooperate by complying with the traffic signs and heeding any instructions given by the Security and Safety Section. Cars which are parked in such a way as to obstruct traffic, particularly those that may cause a risk of accidents or obstruct the movement of emergency vehicles, are liable to be removed by outside companies at the owners' expense.
