The Islamic Republic of Afghanistan would like to express its strong protest in response to the provocative intrusion of the Pakistani's military into Afghan territory in the District of Jaji of Paktia Province, which has resulted in the loss of 13 innocent Afghan citizens' precious lives and more than a dozen injuries.

This act is fully against all the principles of international law, norms and goodneighbourly relations. Hence, we call upon the Government of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan to take necessary steps to remedy this irresponsible act and, more importantly, to prevent any further occurrence of such intrusions.

It is the desire and determination of the people and the Government of Afghanistan to have the best possible relations with all members of the international community, in particular our neighbours, on the basis of the Charter of the United Nations and Kabul's 2002 Good-Neighbourly Relations Declaration.

Based on the aforementioned provocative act by the Government of Pakistan, we would like to request the United Nations to register the present letter as a document of the United Nations and to pursue this matter accordingly.
