PROPOSED PROGRAMME BUDGET FOR THE BIENNIUM 1984-1985

# Revised estimates: effect of changes in rates of exchange and inflation

### Report of the Secretary-General

- 1. In paragraph 23 of the introduction to the proposed programme budget for the biennium  $1984-1985\ 1/$  and paragraph 9 of the first report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions (ACABQ) on the proposed programme budget 2/, it was indicated that developments in exchange rates would be reviewed in order to ensure that the final appropriations were based on the latest available rates.
- 2. Rates of exchange. Revised rates for the following duty stations are proposed based on United Nations operational rates effective at 1 December 1983:

- 3. Inflation rates. The Advisory Committee in paragraph 25 of its first report recommended that the Secretary-General should keep inflation rates under careful review and, if warranted, propose an adjustment towards the end of the thirty-eighth session of the General Assembly to reflect the most recent movements in inflation rates. A revised inflation rate for New York of 5 per cent per year in 1984 and 1985 is proposed in place of the initial projection of 5.5 per cent per year. This reduced rate of inflation is proposed bearing in mind the lower rate of inflation experienced in New York during 1983.
- 4. With respect to other duty stations it is deemed prudent to maintain projected inflation rates at the levels stated in annex IV of the proposed programme budget. In the case of Geneva, Vienna and the Hague, which are budgeted for 5.5 per cent inflation, actual 1983 inflation implicit in the post adjustment indices was 6.7, 6.3 and 6.1 per cent respectively. The other duty stations budgeted for 10 per cent annual inflation presented a mixed picture with many rates exceeding 10 per cent per year. A 10 per cent rate has been retained for those duty stations originally proposed as 10 per cent as well as for United Nations information centres and UNHCR field offices consistent with the recommendation of the Advisory Committee in paragraph 25 of its report.
- 5. The proposed inflation rates have been applied to the levels of salary and other costs based on actual experience in 1983 as reported in the tinal performance report for the 1982-1983 biennium (A/C.5/38/49). This provides a more accurate derivation of projected costs for 1984 and 1985 than would be the case if the revised rates were applied to the 1983 rates which were used in calculating the resource base.
- 6. The new rates have been applied to the proposed programme budget as approved by the Fifth Committee in its first reading and to all revised estimates and statements of administrative and financial implication approved up to and including the 63rd meeting. The effect of the recosting is shown in annex I.
- 7. The overall effect of the recosting of the amounts referred to in paragraph 6 above can be summarized as follows:

- 8. As regards the outstanding items awaiting decisions of the Fifth Committee at the time of writing,
- (a) The consolidated statement of administrative and financial implications in respect of conference-servicing costs has been prepared on the basis of the new rates and any amounts approved in this respect by the Fifth Committee will therefore not require recosting;
- (b) Revised estimates and statements of financial implications still pending at the time of the preparation of this report are listed in annex II, at the current amounts. It is proposed that the amounts eventually approved for these items be recosted at the time they are approved by the Fifth Committee and reflected directly in the amounts submitted to the Fifth Committee at second reading.
