CABLEGRAM DATED 19 JUNE 1954 FROM THE MINISTER FOR EXTERNAL RELATIONS OF GUATEMALA ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of Your Excellency's radiogram dated 20 June 1954, inviting the attention of the Department to a resolution adopted by the Security Council at its 675th meeting calling for the immediate termination of any action likely to cause bloodshed in Guatemala and requesting all Member States of the United Nations to abstain from giving assistance to any such action.

Letter dated 8 July 1954 received by the Secretary-General from the Minister for External Relations of El Salvador

I beg to acknowledge receipt of your cablegram of 20 June 1954, in which you informed me that the Security Council "calls for the immediate termination of any action likely to cause bloodshed" in Guatemala and requests all Members of the United Nations to abstain from giving assistance to either party to the conflict.

In expressing to you my sincere thanks for your communication, I take pleasure in informing you that throughout the conflict in Guatemala my Government, mindful of the principles of the United Nations Charter, maintained a strict policy of non-intervention with the result that it was able to offer successfully its mediation with a view to bringing about a peaceful settlement of the problem.
