NOTE DATED 2 APRIL 1953 FROM THE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE UNITED STATES ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-CENERAL TRANSMITTING A COMMUNIQUE ISSUED BY THE HEADQUARTERS OF THE UNITED NATIONS COMMAND IN KOREA

The Representative of the United States of America to the United Nations presents his compliments to the Secretary-General of the United Nations and has the honour to transmit herewith, for the information of the Security Council, United Nations Command communique No. 1,571, issued in Tokyo Wednesday, April 1, 1953.

UNITED NATIONS COMMAND COMMUNIQUE NO. 1,571, ISSUED IN TOKYO 10:00 A.M., WEDNESDAY, APRIL 1, 1953 (KOREAN TIME)

Three minor enemy probes in the east central sector of the front and routine patrol activity comprised the action in Korea yesterday as ground fighting came to a near-standstill.

Carrier-based aircraft of the United Nations Command Fleet concentrated on targets between Wonsan and Songjin on the east coast and near Haeju in the west. Surface elements shelled frontline positions.

United Nations Command fighter bombers struck at troop and supply centers in central and western North Korea and at anchor points on both ends of the battle line, while light and medium bombers hit other frontline and supply areas.
