**SUMMARY STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON MATTERS OF WHICH
THE SECURITY COUNCIL IS SEIZED AND ON THE STAGE REACHED IN
THEIR CONSIDERATION**

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in document S/20370 of 11 January 1989.

During the week ending 15 April 1989, the Security Council took action on the following item:

The situation relating to Afghanistan (see S/19420/Add.44)

In a letter dated 3 April 1989 addressed to the President of the Security Council (S/20561), the Chargé d'affaires a.i. of the Permanent Mission of Afghanistan to the United Nations transmitted a letter of the same date from his Minister for Foreign Affairs addressed to the President of the Security Council. In that letter, the Minister for Foreign Affairs stated that, taking into consideration the intensification of aggressions and interferences by Pakistan in the internal affairs of Afghanistan, in particular following the completion of the withdrawal of the limited military contingents of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics from Afghanistan, and for prevention of the dangerous prospects of those aggressions, Afghanistan requested the convening of an emergency session of the Security Council, in accordance with the provisions of Articles 34 and 35 (1) of the Charter of the United Nations.

The Security Council continued its consideration of the item at its 2852nd meeting, on 11 April 1989, on the basis of the above request.

In the course of the meeting, the President, with the consent of the Security Council, invited the representatives of Afghanistan, Pakistan and the Syrian Arab Republic, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.
