## Election of the Chairman and officers for the sixty-second session of the General Assembly

1. The Chairman recalled that, in accordance with rule 99 (a) of the Rules of Procedure as amended by General Assembly resolution 56/509 as well as rule 103 as amended by General Assembly resolution 58/126, annex B, paragraph 9, all the Main Committees were required to elect a chairman and a full bureau at least three months before the opening of the session.
2. Ms. Lintonen (Finland) had been nominated for election to the office of Chairman for the sixty-second session. In the absence of further nominations and in accordance with rule 103 of the Rules of Procedure, he would take it that the Committee wished to elect Ms. Lintonen (Finland) Chairman.
3. Ms. Lintonen (Finland) was elected Chairman by acclamation.
4. The Chairman said that further consultations were required as to the composition of the Bureau. The election of the Vice-Chairmen and the Rapporteur would therefore be held at a subsequent meeting of the Committee.
