LETTER DATED 26 FFERMANY 1.964 FROM THE PERMANENT REFRESHMENTIVE OF CYPRUS AUDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY CYPROLIC

In his letter of 24 February 1964, addressed to the Fresident of the Security Council (5/5599), the Acting Representative of Turkey, obviously trying to impress by vehenonce in excreasion, narrates a tale of seige and hardship involving 700 burkish Cypriots Living in the village of Polis. Mr. Asiroglu's professed alarm is totally unwarranted by the facts of the situation. The simple truth is that nothing extraordinary is happening in Polis.

In this councilon, allow me to supply below the text of an official report received from the Foreign Ministry of Cyprus on 17 February, and circulated as a 12088 rolease. It runs as follows:

"Popule that seven hundred Turks surrounded by Greeks in school in Polis are completely unfounded. Situation in Polis normal. Today, United Nations Representative, General Gyani, visited Polis and stated in press conference that 'no special situation exists in Polis'."

Since then the situation continues normal.

Your Excellency is kindly requested to circulate this letter as an official document of the Security Council.
