LETTER DATED 28 MAY 1964 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF  
INDONESIA ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL

Under instructions from my Government, and under rule 37 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, I have the honour to request an invitation to participate without vote in the discussion of the question of apartheid in the forthcoming session of the Security Council.

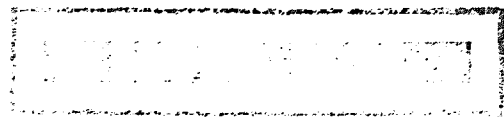
My Government is deeply concerned, in particular, with the fate of approximately 50,000 so-called coloured inhabitants of South Africa of Indonesian descent, who continue to be the victims of the policy of apartheid.

My credentials as representative of my Government will be communicated to the Secretary-General in due time.
