EXCHANGE OF MESSAGES BETWEEN THE PRIME MINISTER OF THE SUDAN AND THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

Telegram dated 9 August 1964 from the Prime Minister of the Sudan addressed to the Secretary-General

The deterioration of the situation in Cyprus is causing us a lot of concern. We are hopeful that the World Organization will spare no efforts to bring the situation under control and avert an armed conflict. I would like to assure Your Excellency at this moment of the unflagging support of the Government and people of the Sudan to the United Nations in its efforts to settle the dispute and preserve world peace. Please accept, etc.

Telegram dated 10 August 1964 from the Prime Minister of the Sudan addressed to the Secretary-General

Since I had addressed you yesterday on the gravity of the situation in Cyprus and its impending danger to world peace, I have been deeply concerned to learn that the situation has further deteriorated. May I again appeal to all concerned to resort to self-restraint and use their influence to achieve an effective cease fire. Accept, etc.
