LETTER DATED 1 SEPTEMBER 1964 FROM THE DEPUTY PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE  
OF CAMBODIA ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL

On the instructions of the Royal Government of Cambodia, I have the honour to communicate the following to you for the information of the members of the Security Council:

"On 28 August 1964, at approximately 6 a.m., about 100 soldiers of the Armed Forces of the Republic of Viet-Nam penetrated over 100 metres into Khmer territory in the khum of Koh Bokar, srok of Peam Chor, province of Prey Veng, where they opened fire on elements of the Cambodian forces. An engagement ensued which lasted over an hour. The aggressors withdrew at approximately 7.20 a.m. under cover of fire from the Moeung Sralin (South Viet-Nam) post which fired a score of shells into Khmer territory.

"In the course of this attack one Cambodian was killed. The aggressors left behind them cartridge cases and clips for automatic weapons."

I should be grateful if you would have this letter circulated as a Security Council document.
