Paragraph 28

The paragraph *should read*:

28. The United Nations has made great strides in improving our mine action planning and rapid response. Within the Framework for Mine Action Planning and Rapid Response, a threat-monitoring matrix is developed monthly so that the Inter-Agency Coordination Group on Mine Action can determine a response based on the most comprehensive picture of the mine and explosive remnants of war threat available. The United Nations Mine Action Service participated in Headquarters-based planning for relevant peace operations, including technical assessment missions to Darfur and Nepal. UNDP supported planning in Algeria, Egypt, the Islamic Republic of Iran, Iraq, Jordan, the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya, Malawi and Zambia and responded rapidly to an ammunition depot explosion in Mozambique in March 2007. An inter-agency assessment mission to south-central Somalia in June 2007 formulated options to address the significant explosive remnants of war contamination problem.
