## Globalization and interdependence

### Report of the Second Committee\*

1. At its 3rd plenary meeting, on 21 September 2007, the General Assembly, on the recommendation of the General Committee, decided to include in the agenda of its sixty-second session the item entitled:

“Globalization and interdependence:

“(a) Globalization and interdependence;

“(b) Science and technology for development;

“(c) Preventing and combating corrupt practices and transfer of assets of illicit origin and returning such assets, in particular to the countries of origin, consistent with the United Nations Convention against Corruption”

and to allocate it to the Second Committee.

2. The Second Committee held a substantive debate on the item at its 19th and 20th meetings, on 31 October and 1 November 2007. An account of the Committee’s discussion of the item is contained in the relevant summary records (A/C.2/62/SR.19 and 20).
