Annotations

1. Election of officers

Rule 15 of the rules of procedure of the functional commissions of the Economic and Social Council stipulates that, at the commencement of the first meeting of a regular session, the Commission shall elect from among the representatives of its members a Chairperson, one or more Vice-Chairpersons and such other officers as



may be required. Following the established practice, the Commission shall elect a Chairperson, three Vice-Chairpersons and a Rapporteur or Vice-Chairperson with rapporteurial responsibilities (Vice-Chairperson-cum-Rapporteur).

In accordance with subparagraph (c) of its decision 2002/210 of 13 February 2002, the Economic and Social Council decided that immediately following the closure of a regular session, the Commission for Social Development would hold the first meeting of its subsequent regular session for the sole purpose of electing the new Chairperson and other members of the Bureau. Consequently, the Commission held the first meeting of its forty-sixth session on 17 February 2007, immediately following the closure of the forty-fifth session, and elected by acclamation Alexei Tulbure (Moldova) as Chairperson of the Commission and Jelena Piá-Comella (Andorra), Dan Zhang (China) and Ignacio Llanos (Chile) as Vice-Chairpersons.

The Group of African States subsequently nominated Bertin A. Babadoudou (Benin) and, upon the resignation of Ms. Piá-Comella (Andorra), the Group of Western European and other States nominated Sonja Anna Kreibich (Germany) to represent their respective regional groups on the Bureau as Vice-Chairpersons-elect. At the opening meeting of the forty-sixth session of the Commission, on 6 February 2008, the nominees will be elected as Vice-Chairpersons. At the same meeting, the Commission will designate one of its Vice-Chairpersons as having rapporteurial responsibilities.

2. Adoption of the agenda and other organizational matters

Rule 7 of the rules of procedure requires that, after the election of its officers at the beginning of each session, the Commission shall adopt the agenda for that session on the basis of the provisional agenda. The provisional agenda and documentation for the forty-sixth session of the Commission were approved by the Economic and Social Council in its decision 2007/258 of 26 July 2007.

The proposed organization of work of the Commission for Social Development at its forty-sixth session (see annex I) has been prepared pursuant to relevant decisions of the General Assembly and the Economic and Social Council to facilitate the consideration of agenda items within the time frame available and in accordance with the conference services allocated to the Commission. The timetable should be considered tentative and indicative: if the Commission completes its consideration of an item ahead of schedule, it may wish to proceed immediately to the next item.

The Commission is scheduled to meet from Wednesday, 6 February, to Friday, 15 February 2008. Arrangements have been made to hold morning and afternoon meetings during the session: morning meetings will be held from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. and afternoon meetings from 3 p.m. to 6 p.m.

The General Assembly, in its resolution 61/143, invited functional commissions of the Economic and Social Council to discuss, within their respective mandates, the question of violence against women in all its forms and manifestations and to set priorities for addressing this issue in their future efforts and work programmes and to transmit the outcome of those discussions to the Secretary-General for his annual report to the Assembly. Consequently, the Commission is invited to hold a panel discussion on the question of violence against women. A note by the Secretariat will be prepared to facilitate the discussion.

Further review of the methods of work of the Commission

Pursuant to Economic and Social Council resolutions 2005/11 of 21 July 2005 and 2006/18 of 26 July 2006, the Commission will undertake a review of the functioning of the two-year review and policy cycle in order to ensure that this approach enhances its effectiveness and functioning, and will also identify the theme for the 2009-2010 review and policy cycle. The Commission will have before it a note by the Secretariat on its future organization and methods of work.

In its resolution 2006/18 of 26 July 2006, the Economic and Social Council decided that the theme for the 2007-2008 review and policy cycle would be "Promoting full employment and decent work for all", taking into account its interrelationship with poverty eradication and social integration. The Commission reviewed the theme at its forty-fifth session in 2007. The Commission will have before it the report of the Secretary-General on the priority theme for the policy part of the 2007-2008 cycle.
