LETTER DATED 7 SEPTEMBER 1963 FROM THE CHARGE D'AFFAIRES A.I. OF
THE PERMANENT MISSION OF TANGANYIKA ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-
GENERAL TRANSMITTING MESSAGE FROM THE VICE-PRESIDENT OF THE
REPUBLIC OF TANGANYIKA

I have the honour to present my compliments to your Excellency and to
communicate in person, on the instructions of my Government, the following message:

Quote: "YOUR EXCELLENCY, I AM INFORMED BY MY PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE
AT THE UNITED NATIONS THAT AT THE REQUEST OF THE AFRICAN MEMBERS OF THE
UNITED NATIONS, THE SECURITY COUNCIL WILL MEET TO DISCUSS THE GRAVE SITUATION
WHICH NOW PREVAILS IN SOUTHERN RHODESIA.

I WOULD THEREFORE ASK YOU TO PRESENT TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY
COUNCIL MY GOVERNMENT'S REQUEST TO PARTICIPATE, THROUGH MY PERMANENT
REPRESENTATIVE AT THE UNITED NATIONS, IN THE DELIBERATIONS OF THE COUNCIL
ON THIS QUESTION, AS PROVIDED FOR BY ARTICLE 31 OF THE CHARTER OF THE UNITED
NATIONS.

ACCEPT, EXCELLENCY, THE ASSURANCES OF MY HIGHEST CONSIDERATION.
