The Representative of the United States of America to the United Nations presents his compliments to the Secretary-General of the United Nations and has the honor to transmit herewith, for the information of the Security Council, United Nations Command communique No. 1,439, issued in Tokyo Thursday, November 20, 1952.

(KOREAN TIME)

Ground action in Korea yesterday was concentrated in the western sectors of the line. Three enemy probes and three enemy attacks on United Nations Command elements in the western area were repulsed. In the west-central sector nine enemy probing attacks were thrown back. Other United Nations Command units continued to maintain their positions. Very few of our patrols reported contacting the enemy.

United Nations Command naval surface craft shelled enemy front-line positions and other enemy targets of opportunity along the east and west coast during yesterday's naval activities.

Land-based planes listed troop concentrations, rail lines, enemy front-line positions, vehicles and an ore processing plant as their targets for the day.
