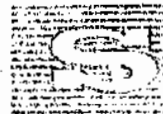

NOTE DATED 12 DECEMBER 1952 FROM THE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE UNITED STATES  
ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL, TRANSMITTING A COMMUNIQUE ISSUED  
BY THE HEADQUARTERS OF THE UNITED NATIONS COMMAND

The Representative of the United States of America to the United Nations  
presents his compliments to the Secretary-General of the United Nations and  
has the honor to transmit herewith, for the information of the Security  
Council, United Nations Command communique No. 1,460, issued in Tokyo  
Thursday, December 10, 1952.

UNITED NATIONS COMMAND COMMUNIQUE NO. 1,460,  
ISSUED IN TOKYO 10:00 A.M., THURSDAY,  
DECEMBER 11, 1952 (KOREAN TIME)

Enemy forces up to two companies in strength attacked United Nations Command positions yesterday in the western sector of the front and sharp fighting occurred in several places. Some action was continuing in this area at the close of the period.

In the west-central sector nine enemy probing patrols, which resulted in engagements lasting up to one hour and five minutes, were repulsed. Elsewhere the Korean battlefield was quiet yesterday.

Land-based United Nations Command aircraft worked around the clock Wednesday to hit enemy installations, supply areas, vehicles and an ore processing plant. Once again friendly fighters scored kills on enemy jets in air-to-air battles.

Surface craft of the United Nations Command Fleet fired harassing missions along the east coast of North Korea, while carrier planes attacked west coast enemy troops positions.
