UNITED NATIONS COMMAND COMMINIQUE NO. 1,466, ISSUED IN TOKYO 10:00 A.M., WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 17, 1952 (KORKAN TIME)

Ground action in Korea was extremely light yesterday, with United Nations Command forces reporting contacts with only seven enemy squad-sized probes, and one probe from an unknown number of enemy. All were repulsed.

Land-based planes, led by impressive victories over enemy jets by United Nations Command fighters, hit hard at enemy targets during daylight and at night. Cargo aircraft completed another week of transporting men and material in support of United Nations efforts in Korea.

Elements of the United Nations Command Fleet carried out limited attacks against enemy targets in spite of unfavorable weather.
