


The Korean battlefront remained relatively quiet. Principal action was that of a United Nations Command raiding party in the western sector which engaged about fifty enemy and overran their positions.

Elsewhere, reports listed a lone enemy probe in the east-central sector and four minor enemy probes in the west-central area. All were repulsed.

Friendly patrols, operating all along the line, reported contacts amounted to only a very few light skirmishes with the enemy.

Communication targets, supply facilities end enemy front-line positions were hit by United Nations Command land-based bombers during day and night operations. Fighters once again scored against enemy jets.

Routine operations were conducted by elements of the United Nations Command Fleet throughout the period.
