LETTER DATED 25 NOVEMBER 1957 FROM THE REPRESENTATIVE OF SAUDI ARABIA
ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL

I have the honour, upon instructions from my Government, and further to my latest communication (Document S/3905 of 7 November 1957), to inform members of the Security Council, through you, of the following renewed violation of Saudi Arabia's air space by the Israeli military aircraft.

"On Thursday, 14 November 1957, an Israeli military aircraft violated Saudi Arabian air space by circulating at a very low altitude over the Saudi town of Haql in the Aqaba Gulf region, and over the Saudi military positions of Hamidha, Isawiya and Al-Ghar, before the aircraft was made to withdraw."

Needless to state here that this new Israeli violation is but a continuation of the provocation by the Israeli authorities against Saudi Arabia's territorial integrity.

The Saudi Arabian Government, while drawing the attention of the United Nations to these provocative acts, wishes to re-emphasize its intentions to undertake, in the appropriate manner, whatever measures it deems suitable to safeguard its interests.

It is the desire of the Saudi Arabian Government to have this note circulated to Member States of the United Nations.
