## Addendum No. 1

I append herewith the following exchange of cables with the President of the Republic of Guinea:

TELEGRAM DATED 6 AUGUST FROM THE PRESIDENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF GUINEA TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

Honour to approach you on behalf of Government and insist on immediate employment our troops in Katanga. If this proposal were not approved my Government would place them under direct authority Congolese Government. Highest consideration.

TELEGRAM DATED 6 AUGUST FROM THE SECRETARY-GENERAL TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF GUINEA

I have received your cable in which you insist upon employing your troops to go into Katanga. As you know the question of the entry of United Nations troops into Katanga will be considered tomorrow by the Security Council. You will also have noted that no decision has been taken from my side to the effect that the United Nations troops should not enter Katanga, provided naturally that this can be done under the terms of reference established by the Security Council. You will also appreciate that no decision has been taken on the final composition of the contingents of the UN Force in Katanga.
