Letter dated 5 March 2008 from the Ambassador and Permanent Representative of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland addressed to the President of the Human Rights Council

The United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland wishes that the following comments be placed on record with regard to the intervention made by Mauritius at the Highlevel Segment of the seventh session of the Human Rights Council on the morning of Wednesday, 5 March 2008:

"The United Kingdom has no doubt about its sovereignty over the British Indian Ocean Territory, which was ceded to Britain in 1814 and has been a British dependency ever since.

As we have reiterated on many occasions, we have undertaken to cede the Territory to Mauritius when it is no longer required for defence purposes."

The United Kingdom would be grateful if its comments could be circulated as a document of the Council.
