CABLE DATED 1 FEBRUARY 1961 ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF
THE SECURITY COUNCIL BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF
THE CONGO (LEOPOLDVILLE) AND COUNTERSIGNED BY THE CHAIRMAN
OF THE COLLEGE OF COMMISSIONERS-GENERAL AND COMMISSIONER-
GENERAL FOR FOREIGN AFFAIRS

The Government of the Republic of the Congo is aware of the extreme need for the assistance given by the United Nations to the Congo and for the continuation of that assistance. But the success of the United Nations operations in the Congo depends entirely on close co-operation between the representatives of the United Nations and the authorities of the Republic of the Congo. Ambassador DAYAL has lost the confidence of the Congolese people and authorities and, in the very interests of the international Organization's operations, we feel compelled to request his recall and his replacement by a neutral person. It is not for us to decide who that person should be; all that we ask is that he be neutral. We wish to reaffirm our full confidence in the Secretary-General of the United Nations and to thank him sincerely for all the efforts he has exerted to solve the Congolese crisis. We also confirm our full confidence in the United Nations, of which the Republic of the Congo is indeed a Member. Highest consideration.
