PROVISIONAL AGENDA

Note by the Secretary-General

In connexion with the provisional agenda of the Commission and the annotations thereto circulated in document E/CN.4/1297 and E/CN.4/1297/Add.1/Rev.1 respectively, the attention of members of the Commission is drawn to resolution 1788 (LIV) adopted by the Economic and Social Council on 18 May 1975 entitled, "Study of discrimination in respect of the right of everyone to leave any country, including his own, and to return to his country, and draft principles on freedom and non-discrimination in respect of that right", operative paragraph 5 of which reads as follows:

"5. Decides that the Commission on Human Rights should retain on its agenda the question of the right of everyone to leave any country, including his own, and to return to his country, and to consider it at three-year intervals coinciding with its discussion of the periodic reports on civil and political rights".
