REPORT OF THE SECRETAEYY-GENERAE OI THE IMPLEMRTTATION OF PARAGRAPH B-ב OT THE SECURITY COONCTE RESOLUIION OF 21 FEBRUARY 1961

Protocnl of 24 Iune 1961 sicned by wr. Mshombe and by the representatives of the Jeopaldville authoritics

## Article 1

Pariiarient shall convene at Leopoldville as soon as possible. The Central Government, assjsted by the United Nations, shail ensure the safety of the Nembers of Parliament.

## Article 2

A new Government shall be consti.tuted and shall come before the Chambers for a vote of confidence. This new Government shall remain in porier until the adoption of the new Constitution. The new Constitution shall be aãopted within a period not exceeding three (3) months.

## Article 3

All custom barriers between Katanga and the rest of the Congo shall be abolished. Goods from Katanga shall be carried along the national route. The Central Government shall ensure the protection of the gocds.

## Article 4

All entry and exit dues levied on goods shall be payable in tineir entirety to the National Exchequer. All dues levjed at Natadi shall be payable to the Central Government at Leopoldville, and those levied in Katanga shall be payable to the Katanga treasury,

## Arcicie 5

A Commission of national experts, assisted if necessary by foreign experts, shall be established for the purpuse of settiling the disputes of parastatal companjes and of those enjoying special atatus, suciz as CSK, CNKI, INEAC, OTRACO.

## Articie 6

Currency: during the trangitiounl period, a single currency shall be legal tender, but shall bear two monetary symbols. The two monetary symbols shall be gradually replaced by a single monetary symbol. During this period, Katanga shall be represented on the Currency Council.

## Article 7

Social, educational and adminfutrative problena. In the educational sphere, curricula at secondary, higher and undversiby lewels shall be unified in order that academic grades, established and organized by the central power, may be conferred. In the administrative sphere, the respective states shall be represented in the Commission to be estabiished under the agreement of 17 April 1961. The States shall propose that the commission approve technicians selecter by them. In reaching its decisions on such proposals, the Commission shall be guided solely by the interests of the States. Where a proposal is rejected, the state concerned shall be requested to submit further proposals.

## Article 8

Diplomatic representation. Representation abroad is within the exclusive competence of the Head of State. During the transitional period, pruatical measures shall be taken to ensure that there shall henceforth be only a single diplomatic representation abroad.

## Article 9

Maluba problem. The delegation of Katanga undertakes to release all politicel prisoners immediately and unconditionally. A Commission of Inquiry assisted by representatives of both parties shall be established by the Central Government. The President of the Govermant of Katanga agrees to meet Mr. Sendwe outside Leopoldville and in the presence of the Commission of Inquiry.

## Article 10

Military problems. With regard to military problems, the two delegations shall refer to the agrement concluded between the headquarters of the Congolese National Army and the authorities of Katanga. This agreement shall be implemented imaediately.

## Article 11

The two parties undertake on their honour to exsure the complete implementation of these agreements.

The agreement between ieopoldville and Katanga has been signed on behalf of Leopoldvilie by: Bolikango, Bomboko, Lihau, Nkayi, Dericovard, Kebangui, Massa, Kimvayi, Kisolokela, Mehamba, and on Dehalf of Katanga by: Tshombe ard Kimba.
