LETTER DATED 31 AUGUST 1950 FROM THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL
ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

I am sending you herewith the following two telegrams received by me from a number of organizations in Northern China protesting against the barbarous bombing of Chinese territory by American aircraft.

These telegrams read as follows:

"The American imperialists have, in total disregard of the wishes of the people of the whole world, violated world peace and ruthlessly bombed the people of Korea. On August 27, they even ventured to repeatedly invade the inviolable territorial air of the Republic of China, with the result that three of our fellow citizens were killed and twenty-one wounded. Such barbarous action of imperialist aggression is one which we can never tolerate. The demands which Foreign Minister Chou En-Lai of the People's Republic of China has raised before the Security Council of the United Nations and the protest which he has lodged with the United States Government are perfectly solemn and just, to which we wish to pledge our whole-hearted support. The Security Council of the United Nations should immediately take most effective measures to impose severe sanctions on the American imperialist aggression forces in Korea, and urge their prompt and complete withdrawal there from. It should also ask the United States Government to compensate all the losses sustained by China.
