Note by the Secretary-General***

1. In accordance with the provisions of Article 12, paragraph 2, of the Charter of the United Nations and with the consent of the Security Council, the Secretary-General has the honour to notify the General Assembly of matters relative to the maintenance of international peace and security that are being dealt with by the Security Council.

2. The matters relative to the maintenance of international peace and security of which the Security Council is seized are set out below. Items with which the Council has ceased to deal since the notification to the General Assembly at its sixty-second session (A/62/300) have been deleted. Those deletions, made pursuant to the notes by the President of the Security Council dated 19 July 2006 (S/2006/507) and 19 December 2007 (S/2007/749), are recorded in document S/2008/10/Add.13.
