Page 10, paragraph 44

For the existing text <u>substitute</u>

44. The new legislation thus broadly defines the crime of trafficking to include a number of illegal purposes: prostitution, sexual crimes, slavery or forced labor, removal of organs, pornography, and using the body of a person to give birth to a baby who is then forcibly taken from her. The Anti Trafficking Law definitions do not require trafficking or slavery to be undertaken using force, coercion, pressure, or fraud, under the assumption that the Israeli society will not countenance these practices even if the victim "consented."
