Note by the Secretary-General

The Secretary-General has received the following communication relating to the membership of the Sub-Commission on Prevention of Discrimination and Protection of Minorities and has the honour to transmit it to the Commission.

Communication dated 15 March 1962 from the Ambassador and Permanent Representative of France to the United Nations:

"With reference to item 6 (c) of the agenda of the eighteenth session of the Commission on Human Rights, I have the honour to inform you that, with the consent of the French Government, the representative of France in the Commission on Human Rights has decided to re-nominate Mr. Pierre Juvigny, Master of Requests of the <u>Conseil d'Etat</u>, for election to the Sub-Commission on Prevention of Discrimination and Protection of Minorities."

Born at Charleville (Ardennes) on 9 August 1920 Admitted as Junior Member of the <u>Conseil d'Etat</u> in 1946 Appointed Master of Requests of the <u>Conseil d'Etat</u> in 1955 Technical Adviser, later <u>Chef de Cabinet</u>, to the Minister of Labour (1946-49) Technical Adviser to the Minister of Education (1950) Director-General of Labour and Manpower (1956) Member of the French delegation to:
