SUMMARY STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON MATTERS OF WHICH THE SECURITY COUNCIL IS SEIZED AND ON THE STAGE REACHED IN THEIR CONSIDERATION

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in document S/16270 of 11 January 1984, S/16270/Add.4 of 7 February 1984 and S/16270/Add.12 of 4 April 1984.

During the week ending 5 May 1984, the Security Council took action on the following item:

In a letter dated 30 April 1984 addressed to the President of the Security Council (S/16514), the representative of Cyprus requested that the Security Council be urgently convened to consider the grave situation in Cyprus caused by the new actions of Turkey and that it take effective measures, in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Charter of the United Nations, for the full and effective implementation of its resolutions in all their aspects.

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 2531st meeting, held on 3 May 1984, on the basis of the request from Cyprus. The Council continued its discussion of the item at its 2532nd to 2534th meetings, held on 3 and 4 May 1984.

In the course of meetings, the President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Afghanistan, Algeria, Antigua and Barbuda, Australia, Cyprus, Ecuador, Greece, Sri Lanka, the Syrian Arab Republic, Turkey and Yugoslavia, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote. In accordance with the agreement reached in the course of the Council's consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Mr. Rauf Denktas.
