## **Annotations and list of documents**

### **Item 1 Organizational matters**

In accordance with Executive Board decision 2006/14 and rule 7 of the Rules of Procedure of the Executive Board of UNDP and UNFPA, the Board will elect a new Bureau consisting of a President and four Vice-Presidents. The election will take place on 9 January 2009. According to the established pattern of rotation of posts among the various regional groups, the President of the Executive Board for 2009 should be elected from the Board members of the Asia and the Pacific States group.

Under this item, the Executive Board will adopt the agenda and agree on the work plan for the session as presented by the Secretary of the Board. The Board will also approve the report of its second regular session 2008. A draft report was distributed to Board members for their comments; the final report contains comments received by or before the deadline.

In accordance with decision 96/25, a work plan for 2009 was prepared by the secretariat in consultation with the Bureau of the Board and is submitted to the Board for adoption.

### **Item 2 Financial, budgetary and administrative matters**

The report on cost classification in UNDP is presented in response to Executive Board decision 2007/33 on proposals for programming arrangements for 2008-2011 and decision 2008/1 on the UNDP biennial support budget, 2008-2009. The document contains a conceptual framework to initiate discussions for arriving at a more transparent, results-oriented and coherent cost classification system in UNDP. The framework, based on Executive Board guidance, will eventually form an integral part of the biennial support budget, 2010-2011, and the mid-term review of the programming arrangements, 2008-2011. These two matters are scheduled for formal consideration by the Executive Board at its second regular session 2009.

**Item 3**  
**Country programmes and related matters**

At the second regular session 2008, UNDP presented a 'road map' for the possible resumption of UNDP activities in the Democratic People's Republic of Korea. The proposed 'road map' envisaged consultations with all stakeholders resulting in a submission to the Board, at its first regular session 2009, of a package of measures and a country programme to facilitate the resumption of UNDP activities. The President of the Board recommended that UNDP proceed with the 'road map', and the Board decided to include the Democratic People's Republic of Korea under the country programmes agenda item in the tentative work plan for the session. In implementing the 'road map', UNDP is submitting for consideration by the Board a package of proposed measures for the resumption of UNDP programmes in DPRK, including a request for UNDP to approve assistance to DPRK on a project-by-project basis until the end of 2010. The document outlines the programme interventions to be supported by UNDP, as well as a tentative agreement reached with DPRK on operational modalities that will be used – in particular in the areas of programme implementation, human resources and finance. The Executive Board may wish to adopt a decision on the resumption of the UNDP programme in DPRK.

As requested by the Executive Board in its decisions 2001/11 and 2006/36, the following country programmes will be approved on a no-objection basis, without presentation or discussion, unless at least five members have informed the secretariat in writing before the meeting of their wish to bring a particular country programme before the Board:

Africa region: Angola, Côte d'Ivoire, Kenya, Mauritania, Niger, the Republic of the Congo;

Asia and the Pacific region: Timor-Leste;

Latin America and the Caribbean region: Haiti, Venezuela.

**Item 7**  
**United Nations Office for Project Services**

The proposed UNOPS Financial Regulations and Rules are submitted in accordance with Executive Board decision 2008/35. The regulations and rules, to take effect on

1 February 2009, attempt to codify and reinforce a number of institutional imperatives, including: risk management; internal financial controls; separation of duties; and internal and external audit functions. They will enable UNOPS to operate on the basis of full cost recovery and generate a net surplus sufficient to maintain its operational reserves. The proposed Financial Regulations and Rules would permit the Executive Director, *inter alia*: to accept contributions to the UNOPS biennial administrative budget and projects; to make project payments in advance of receipt of project funds; and to redeploy funds within an approved biennial administrative budget, provided that the net revenue target established by the Executive Board remains unchanged. The regulations and rules also address the effective and efficient management of all UNOPS resources, including cash, inventories, property, plant and equipment. The Executive Board may wish to approve the UNOPS Financial Regulations and Rules and adopt a decision, elements of which are contained in the report.

The Board will also have before it a comprehensive package of post reclassifications to conform to United Nations job standards and to reflect the operational realities of UNOPS. The exercise responds to the need for a function- and talent-based post classification at UNOPS, and improvements are expected to help to mitigate high turnover costs, raise productivity and encourage appropriate inter-organization mobility. No approved changes are to take effect until financially feasible. Due to its fully self-financing status, UNOPS seeks no external funding to cover the cost of the proposed post upgrades. The Executive Board may wish to approve the proposed post reclassifications and the associated increase in the 2008-2009 biennial administrative budget.

### **Item 4 Recommendations of the Board of Auditors**
